**(2) Charles Darwin**

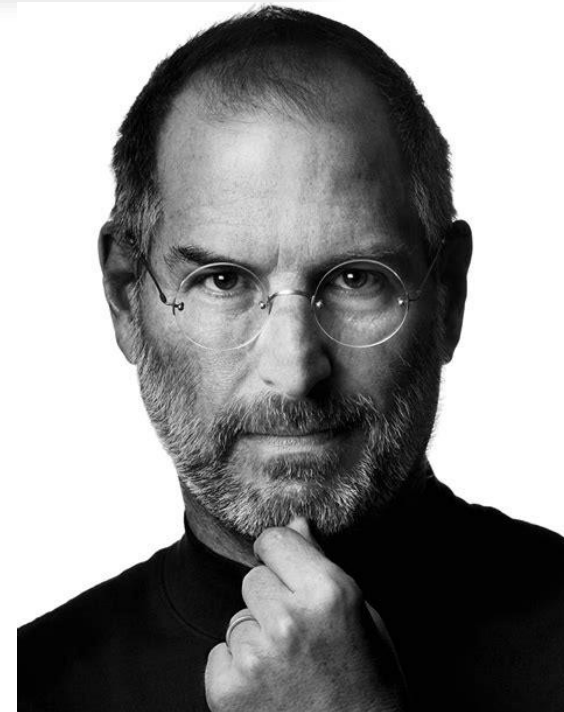
collected over 2,000 prescriptions by reading traditional Chinese medical books and interviewing experienced doctors.

**What do the three learning experiences have in common?**

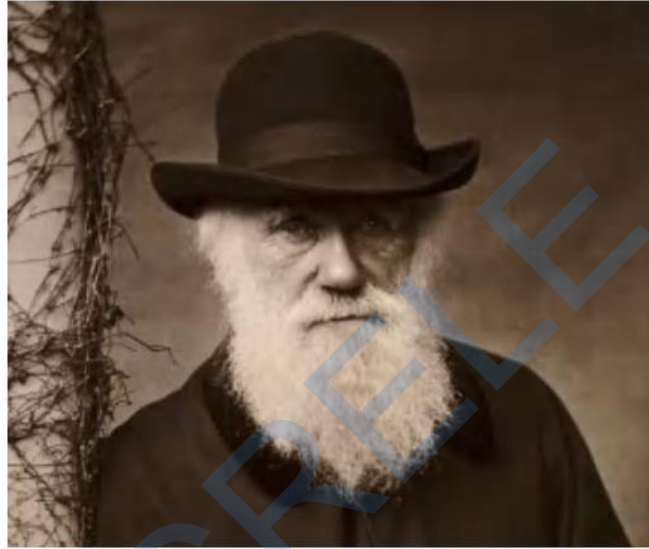
- **All of them are written in the first person.**
