Pre-writing

1. In what cases will people prefer to read a summary rather than a complete passage? What are the features of a summary?

Reference answer; When people want to know the main idea of the passage quickly, they tend to read a summary rather than a complete passage.

The features of summary are:

- brief;
- objective;
- accurate
- easy to read;
- loyal to the original passage;

2. Read the following sentences taken from a summary and point out the mistakes in them.

- In the original passage, the author tells us the history and significance of the silk road. (The underlined part is redundant)
- Fine art, architecture, music, dance, cuisine, dressing styles and all kinds of performances were shared along the silk road. (The underlined part contains too many details)
- The author says silk road plays an important role in the trade and exchange between Asia and Europe, but I don't agree with him on this point. (Summary should be loyal to the original passage, that is to say: objective. No comment or criticism is allowed)

3. Come up with a checklist of summary writing.

Summary Writing should:

4. What is claim, counterclaim and evidence? Can you mark claim, counterclaim and evidence in the following paragraph?

Some people think cartoons will affect students' study. (claim) This is right because there are so many examples where some students' school performance becomes worse and worse resulting from cartoons. (evidence) However others argue that cartoons help students develop their imagination. (counterclaim)

While-writing

1. Read the blog and complete the outline of it on Page 48.

Introduction: Old buildings with rich cultural heritage should not be reconstructed or removed.

Claim: Old buildings in the city should be rebuilt or torn down.

Evidence 1: Old buildings are outdated and can't blend in with modern architecture.

Evidence 2: Historical buildings, if not renovated, will gradually lose their value.

Counterclaim: Historical buildings should not be significantly changed.

Evidence 1: Old buildings attract people and boost tourism.

Evidence 2: Historical buildings reflect culture, strengthen identity and remind people of heritage.

Conclusion: Historical buildings should not be rebuilt or removed.

2. Pick out the main points and use your own words to summarize the blog in no more than 60 words. (answers may vary)

Although some people think old buildings should be reconstructed or pulled down because they are outdated, difficult to blend in with modern architecture and will lose value if not renovated, the author thinks that we should protect and preserve historical buildings. The reasons are that they boost cultural tourism, enforce national identity, and remind people of their history and culture. (60 words)
