Learning Tasks

Activity 1: Match famous people to their own learning experiences.

(1) Tu Youyou	introduced his scientific theory after returning from a five-year journey around the world, during which he finished 770 pages of diaries and 1,750 pages of notes.
(2) Charles Darwin	collected over 2,000 prescriptions by reading traditional Chinese medical books and interviewing experienced doctors.
(3) Nelson Mandela	learned a new language in prison and used that language to fight for his people's freedom.

Activity 2: Skim the text and figure out what the three learning experiences have in common.

What do the three learning experiences have in common?

All of them are written in the first person.

All of them are early learning experiences of famous people.

Activity 3: Read each learning experience and answer the questions.

1. What was a great trial to 6-year-old Marie Curie?

She was frequently brought forward to recite when there were visitors.

2. Where did Charles Darwin's learning occur?

In the laboratory. / In the fields.

3. What did Charles Darwin learn?

He learned the meaning of experimental science. /

He learned many practical skills. He learned that it was unnecessarily cruel to shame a person.

4. How did Charles Darwin learn it?

Darwin helped his brother with his experiments and read books on chemistry with great care. /

The donkey unseated Mandela, embarrassing him in front of his friends.

Activity 4: Figure out what the three learning experiences have in common based on what has been learned.

What do the three learning experiences have in common?

All of them took place outside the classroom.

Each experience had made a great influence on the person.

Assignments:

1. Read the text aloud at least three times and pay attention to the stress, pause and tones.
2. Complete the table with information from the text in Comprehension Part on P6 in the textbook.
3. Search the Internet and find an autobiography that includes inspiring learning experiences and recommend it to other students.
