

Why Do We Explore?

detail 2

Right now, men and women are working on the next steps to go farther than we have ever gone before. New vessels will carry us and new destinations await us. Everything we have ever accomplished leads to this moment in time where exploration will now take us to the planets and the stars. Our nearest neighbours in the night sky have beckoned us, invited us, dared us to reach for them.

conclusion


