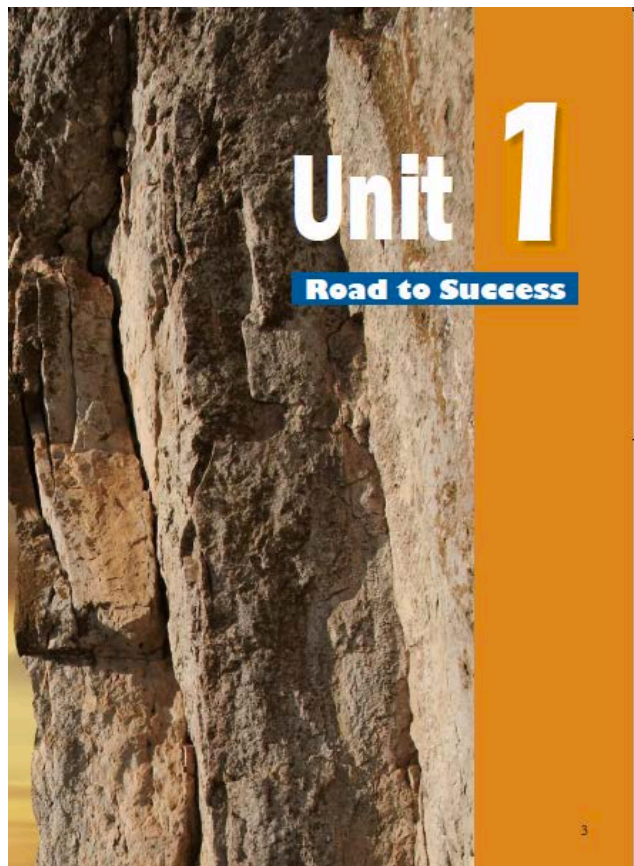

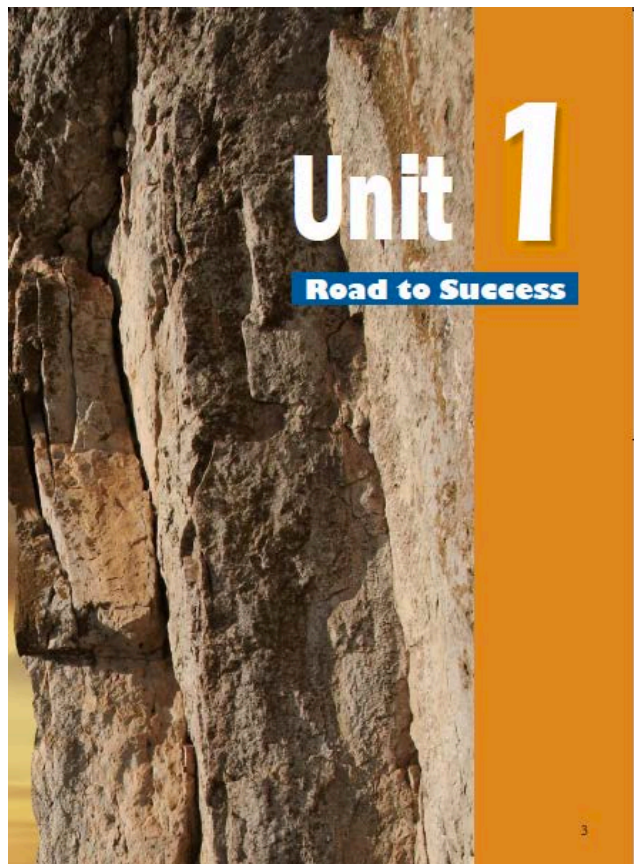

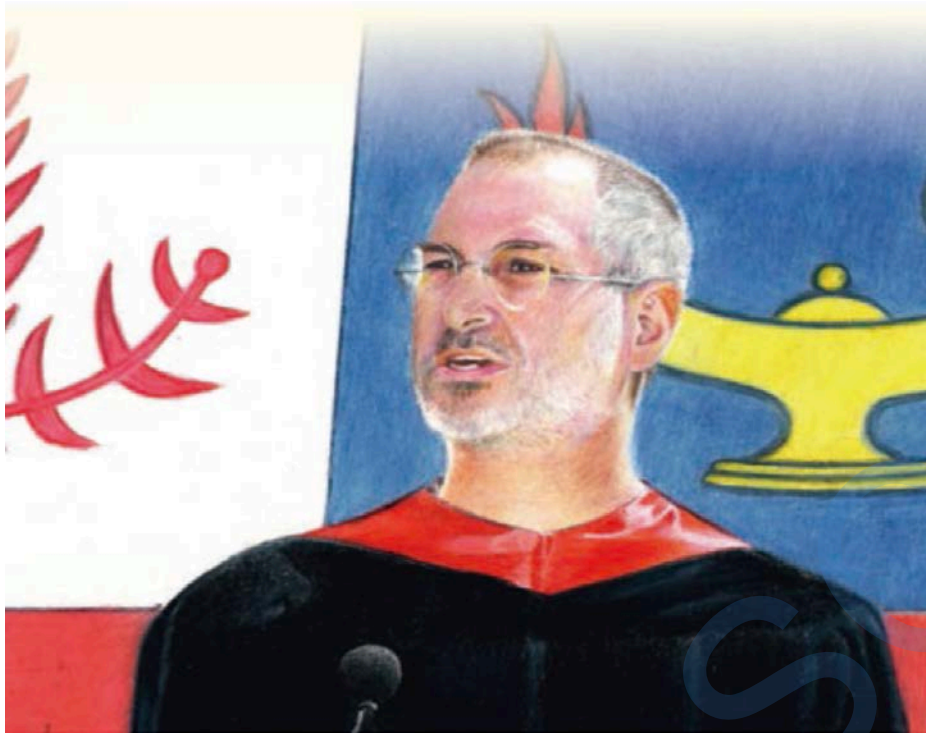

Studying sentence patterns

What makes the opening remarks and closing sentences impressive?

- *I'm honoured to be with you today for...*
- *And now, as you graduate to begin anew, I wish that for you.*

Are there other possible versions that can start a speech successfully?

- *I'm grateful for this opportunity to ... /I'd like to thank you for inviting me...(acknowledge the occasion)*
- *I'd like to thank you for coming. (show welcome)*
- *I'm going to speech about something that is of great importance to use. (mention the significance)*
- *Over the next ten minutes you are going to hear about something that will change your life...(arouse interest)*

Read opening lines of J. K. Rowling's commencement speech at Harvard in 2008.
What makes them impressive?

- *Addressing the audience: and, above all, graduates.*
- *Using humor by adding a personal touch:... have made me lose weight. A win-win situation!*
- *Using a clever metaphor: the world's largest Gryffindor reunion.*



Are there other possible versions that can bring a speech to an impressive end?

- *I'd like to finish by...*
- *I hope I have given you a clear picture of...*
- *That was all I had to say on..*
- *I'm afraid that the clock is against us. So...*
- *You have been a great audience. Than you.*

- Read the closing lines of Rowling's speech. Are there similarities compared with Job's speech?
- Quotation: As is a tale, so is life: not how long it is, but how good it is, is what matters.
- Extending good wishes: I wish you all very good lives.
- Expressing gratitude: Thank-you very much.





Studying sentence patterns

What makes the points stated forceful?

- *So you have to trust that...*
- *I'm convinced that...*
- *If you haven't found..., keep ... Don't...*
- *Having lived through it, I can now say this to you....*

- Are there other possible versions that can naturally present a personal opinion in speaking?
- *As far as I am concerned*
- *For my part*
- *Personally speaking*
- *As I see it*
- *It seems to me that*
- *If you ask me*



Studying words and expressions

application n.

--The application of a rule or piece of knowledge is the use of it in a particular situation. 运用

- ***Students learned the practical application of the theory they had learned in the classroom.***

--An application for something such as a job or membership of an organization is a formal written request for it. 申请

- ***I wonder when I'll be informed about my application for the job.***



Studying words and expressions

dawn on

- If a fact or idea dawns on you, you realize it. 被领悟; 被想到
- ***It gradually dawned upon me that I still had talent and ought to run again.***



Studying words and expressions



convinced

--If you are convinced that something is true, you feel sure that it is true.

深信的; 确信的

- ***He became convinced of the need for cheap editions of good quality writing.***
- ***He was convinced that I was part of the problem.***



Studying words and expressions



settle

--If you settle yourself somewhere or settle somewhere, you sit down or make yourself comfortable. (使) 处于舒适的位置;

- **Jessica settled into her chair with a small sigh of relief.**

--If something settles or if you settle it, it sinks slowly down and becomes still. (使) 缓慢沉落

- **A black dust settled on the walls.**
- 引申含义：停止前进的脚步



Studying words and expressions



live through

--If you live through an unpleasant event or change, you experience it and survive. 经过（不愉快的事件或变故）之后仍旧活着

- ***We are too young to have lived through the war.***
- ***It's been like living through a nightmare.***



Studying words and expressions

begin anew 重新开始

--If you do something anew, you do it again, often in a different way from before. 重新, 再一次

- ***She's ready to start anew.***
- ***He began his work anew.***
