Read the following excerpt from a poem on friendship. Do you agree with the poet? What is your understanding of friendship?






What does "peas and carrots" mean in Chinese?

■ 1. What is the interviewee's view on "true friendship"?


True friendship is having faith on someone, respecting the person from the bottom of our heart, and helping the person whenever he or she is in need.
